Comment [JLC181]: Make more active -"stepped through..."

Comment [JLC182]: Or "...stepped over the threshold, leading a group of <u>Mosnits</u>."

Comment [JLC183]: Do you mean "leading"? (atherwise Clearbrook would enter after the Mosnits)

Comment [JLC184]: Word choice - "...watched the Mosnit bloodfolk walk[or. pile] into the inn."

Comment [JLC693]: Hmm. What does this mean? Who are the keepers? The <u>Vaspien's</u> Vigor can be destroyed?Or what is the precious stone?

What if we said:

"Failing to do so will lead us, the Following of the Anfybes and keeper of Vaspien's Vigor," he said as he turned to the seated Anfybes behind him and spread his arms wide. "To destroy this precious stone."2
